Transfer Partnership with Midlands Technical College

The University of South Carolina (UofSC) and **Midlands Technical College** (MTC) have partnered to create direct transfer tracks within specific majors, allowing MTC students to earn an associate degree prior to transferring to UofSC. MTC students who meet the admissions requirements for the University and for the academic major and who meet the application deadline are guaranteed admission to the University of South Carolina to continue their degree program.
