OneCarolina By the Numbers

Last month, students at the Columbia campus successfully registered for the fall semester using the new Self Service Carolina system, marking the first time students registered for classes without using VIP in nearly 20 years. Self Service Carolina is part of the OneCarolina project, which will streamline and modernize USC's digital community. Here are some interesting facts about OneCarolina:

--To date, 25,665 students have registered for 121,932 courses

--52,072 people filed for Financial Aid for the 2013-14 school year using OneCarolina --Campuses have awarded more than \$317,285,000 in financial aid using the new system

--In July, Accounts Receivable will go live through OneCarolina, allowing students to pay fees and tuition through the new system.
